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**Title:** straightforward, informative, engaging, and represents the contents of the article.

**Abstract:** concise (100–250 words) and at least contain the problem, purpose, method, key findings, and research contributions.

**Keywords:** accurately represent the purpose and coverage of the research. It is recommended to use 5-6 appropriate and relevant keywords.

**Introduction:** Informing the reader about the significance of the study or research, presenting substantial problems, gap analysis, and novelty approaches to fill the gaps that define the research objectives or thesis statement.

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**References:** should be accountable, with about 80% of the material from primary sources (reputable academic publications) and up to date (last ten years), and utilizing reference management tools, such as Mendeley.
